IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Students accepted into the program are entitled to a copy of the Criminal Justice Department's Graduate Handbook upon registering. If one is not mailed to you, please be sure to request one. We encourage you to use it as your first source of reference for answers to your questions.
- Any graduate student placed on provisional status must earn at least a 3.00 accumulative grade point average within the first 12 semester hours of graduate course work or be separated from the program. If the student earns the minimum grade point average, **it is the student's responsibility to notify the Graduate Coordinator**, who will then review the student's file and, if appropriate, recommend a change in status to the Graduate School.
- Each graduate student must select a committee and a major professor from the Criminal Justice Department to guide their progress through the program. This committee will assist the student with curriculum advisement, preparation and oral defense of a thesis, or information regarding the graduate special topic paper. **The student is responsible for filing a Committee Form with the Graduate Coordinator** once selection of committee members is finalized.
- If a student's overall graduate GPA falls below 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, the student will be placed on "probation" and notified by mail of this status. A student on academic probation must bring the cumulative GPA to a 3.0 by the end of the next semester and/or completion of 12 hours. Failure to do so will result in immediate recommendation for separation from the graduate program.
- A student who receives two grades of "C" in their core or emphasis courses will be terminated from the program.
- Applications for graduate assistantships should be received by April 15 for the next academic year. Guidelines for eligibility and evaluation are printed in the CRJUS Graduate Handbook, pages 11-12.
- A maximum of 6 semester hours of CRJUS 6955 (Independent Study) and CRJUS 6957 (Readings in CRJUS) can apply toward the degree when either course is repeated. If taking both courses, a maximum of 9 s.h. can apply.
- The selection of elective course work is not the sole prerogative of the student and **must** be done in consultation with his/her major professor and subject to the approval of the Graduate Coordinator.
- Students should refer to the Graduate Handbook for general regulations and recommended form and style for research papers and theses.
